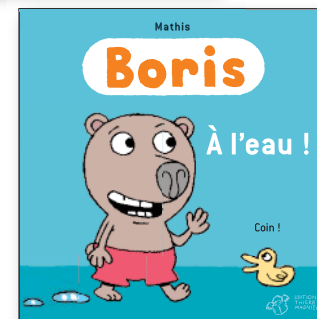

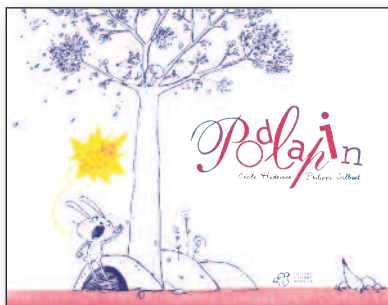
IN THE WATER

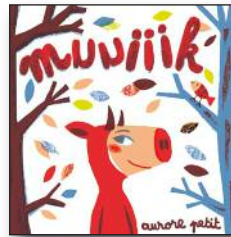

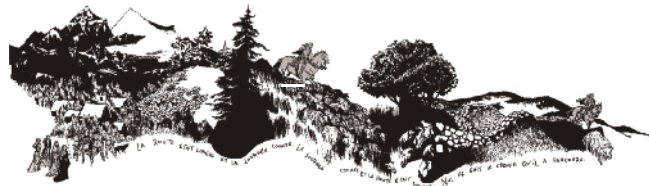

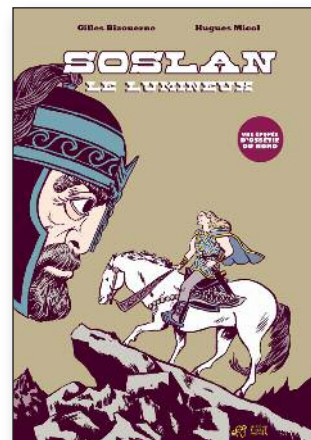
THE GREAT SOSLAN

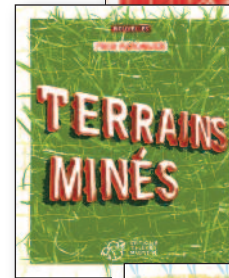


MINEFIELDS

Whether it takes place in France, Irak, or Africa, in times of peace or war and under a democracy or a dictatorship, soccer will always be a universal language.

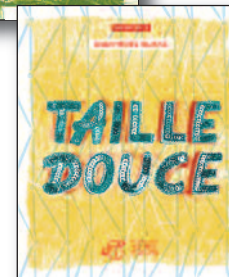

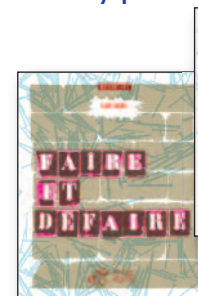

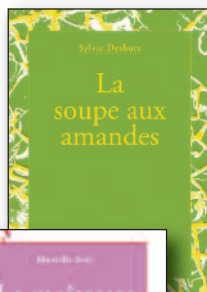

By *Mikaël Ollivier*

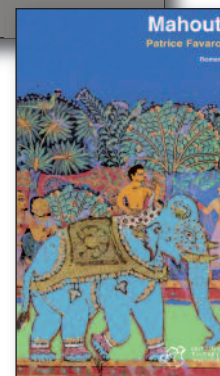

In India, elephants play an important part being at the same time, slave workers, movie actors, and major part of religious Indian ceremonies.

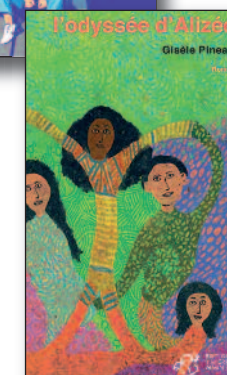

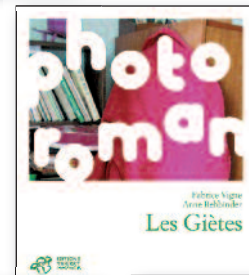
